Alyaa Abdulghany – No. 4 player in the Golfweek Rankings, secured her spot on the United States Junior Ryder Cup Team with her Runner-up finish at the Junior PGA Championship at Wannamoisett Country Club in Rumford.

Hailey Jones – Most recent win at the 2017 Under Armour® / Hunter Mahan Championship presented by Baylor Scott & White Sports Therapy & Research where she carded a 5-under-par 139. Won the Legends Junior Tour's 2015 Player of the Year award in the Girls 12-18 Division by amassing a whopping 8,800 points.

Lucy Li –Currently holds records as the youngest qualifier for the U.S. Women's Amateur and the U.S. Women's Open. Li was an age group winner at the inaugural Drive, Chip, and Putt Championship at Augusta National Golf Club. Li secured her spot on the United States Junior Ryder Cup Team with her win at the 2016 Junior PGA Championship at Wannamoisett Country Club in Rumford, R.I.

Kaitlyn Papp – Is the No. 4 player in the Golfweek rankings; won the 2016 U.S. Women's Four-ball Championship with Hailee Cooper; and advanced to the Round of 64 in the U.S. Women's Amateur.

Brooke Seay – Nothing but top-10 finishes in 2017. The 16-year-old has two tournament titles to her name including the 2015 AJGA Junior All-Star at El Conquistador and the 2017 ANNIKA Invitational.

Yujeong Son – The sophomore at Norman High School also advanced to the semifinal of the 2016 U.S. Girls' Junior Championship and is No. 8 in the Polo Golf Rankings. Youngest Oklahoma State Women Amateur champion at age 13, 2014, and achieved a consecutive win in 2015.

Paphangkorn Tavatanakit – 2016 Rolex Junior Player of the Year. Won two AJGA Invitationals in 2016, Rolex Tournament of Champions and the season-ending PING Invitational. Tavatanakit's PING Invitational score of 12-under-par 204 shattered Esther Choe's 2006 tournament record of 6-under-par 210.

Rose Zhang – The 14-year-old won tournament titles in 2016 at the AJGA / CJGT Junior at Yorba Linda and the AJGA Preview at River Ridge.

Cole Hammer –US Open debut, Chambers Bay 2016. Finished second at The Junior PLAYERS Championship presented by TaylorMade-adidas Golf.

Turner Hosch – Won his first AJGA event at the 2017 Bishops Gate Golf Academy Junior at Horseshoe Bay carding a 9-under-par 207.

Kaiwen Liu – Won the San Diego Section title last year with a record-setting performance, he holds the section record with the 14-under par 130 that he shot last year in winning the title.

Sean Maruyama – Son of three-time PGA Tour winner Shigeki Maruyama. Held off a late charge from Trevor Brown, to clinch the title at 99th Western Junior at Red Run Golf Club in Royal Oak, Michigan.

Clay Seeber – Has won two tournaments in his four years with the AJGA: the 2014 Stockton Convention & Visitors Bureau Junior All-Star and the 2016 Justin Rose Junior All-Star Invitational at Reynolds Lake Oconee.

Shuai Ming – 17-year-olds Frankie Capan and Shuai Ming Wong win U.S. Amateur Four-Ball.

Nicole Whiston – Won her first event at the 2017 PING Heather Farr Classic recording a 11-under-par 205. Whiston climbed her way to No. 17 in the AJGA Rankings by only finishing outside of the top-20 on two occasions in her three-year AJGA career.

Ricky Castillo – Named a first-team Rolex Junior All-American after posting three top-three finishes in AJGA events. Finishing second at the Callaway Golf Junior Championship and third at The PING Invitational helped Castillo earn a spot on the Wyndham Cup West Team roster and the No. 6 spot in the Polo Golf Rankings.

Ryan Grider – The recent high school graduate earned two tournament titles in his six years as an AJGA junior: the 2015 Bishops Gate Golf Academy Junior at Horseshoe Bay and the 2016 Toyota Music City Junior. The 2015 Rolex Junior All-American has signed a National Letter of Intent to continue his career at Baylor University in the fall. During his time with the AJGA, Grider earned 19 top-10 finishes in national tournaments.
