2018 Bodega Headlands Vineyard 'Cuvée Elizabeth'


The 2018 Bodega Headlands Vineyard Cuvée Elizabeth is an ethereal, precise wine that perfectly balances energy and grace.

The growing conditions on the coast were ideal in 2018. The summer months were cooler than normal and these mild, slow ripening conditions lasted until mid-September when our vineyards reached the early edge of ripeness and we began to pick. For the next ten days, temperatures remained below normal and we were able to continue picking at a comfortable pace. This allowed us to process fewer tons each day, maximizing the percentage of intact, whole berries in our fermenters and keeping the juicing of the berries during de-stemming to a minimum. This set the stage for a very gradual start to fermentation.

We believe this encourages the production of high-toned, red-fruited, lacy and extremely vivid aromatics and flavors, which are the signature of our coastal vineyards.

"The 2018 Pinot Noir Bodega Headlands Cuvée Elizabeth is a gorgeous, elegant wine. Hints of rose petal, cinnamon and crushed red berry fruit all grace this lithe, understated Pinot Noir. In its first impression, the Cuvée Elizabeth is the most aromatic and lifted of these wines, but it gains volume and darker tonalities of fruit with aeration. If opened young, the 2018 will benefit immensely from being opened in advance."

2018 Occidental Station Vineyard

The 2018 Occidental Station Vineyard is a brilliant example of energy and concentration.

The growing conditions on the coast were ideal in 2018. The summer months were cooler than normal and these mild, slow ripening conditions lasted until mid-September when our vineyards reached the early edge of ripeness and we began to pick. For the next ten days, temperatures remained below normal and we were able to continue picking at a comfortable pace. This allowed us to process fewer tons each day, maximizing the percentage of intact, whole berries in our fermenters and keeping the juicing of the berries during de-stemming to a minimum. This set the stage for a very gradual start to fermentation.

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"The 2018 Pinot Noir Occidental Station is a dense, packed Pinot. Its huge core of fruit gives the Occidental Station tons of inner strength. Readers will have to be patient. Time in the glass brings out a whole range of inky red fruit, blood orange, exotic spice aromas and flavors, with swaths of tannin that wrap it all together. As always, the Occidental Station is quite a different beast from the other wines in the range, as it emerges from a site about fifteen miles from the winery that is quite a bit warmer and therefore lends a decidedly more exotic, ripe personality to the flavors. Even so, there is plenty of supporting structure and minerality to balance things out."

2018 Running Fence Vineyard 'Cuvée Catherine'

The 2018 Running Fence Vineyard 'Cuvée Catherine' is a striking wine that speaks with such a distinct voice that it is hard to imagine it could have come from anywhere else.

The summer months were cooler than normal and these mild, slow ripening conditions lasted until mid-September when our vineyards reached the early edge of ripeness and we began to pick. For the next ten days, temperatures remained below normal and we were able to continue picking at a comfortable pace. This allowed us to process fewer tons each day, maximizing the percentage of intact, whole berries in our fermenters and keeping the juicing of the berries during de-stemming to a minimum. This set the stage for a very gradual start to fermentation.

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"The 2018 Pinot Noir Running Fence Vineyard Cuvée Catherine is endowed with serious depth and intensity that give it a real feeling of vertical depth. The fruit profile leans towards the more blue/purplish realm, but it is the wine's understated richness that is impossible to miss. 2018 SWK Vineyard

No other Occidental pinot noir is so salty and mineral-rich in character as the 2018 SWK Vineyard. This wine is nervy, chiseled, tightly-wound.

The growing conditions on the coast were ideal in 2018. The summer months were cooler than normal and these mild, slow ripening conditions lasted until mid-September when our vineyards reached the early edge of ripeness and we began to pick. For the next ten days, temperatures remained below normal and we were able to continue picking at a comfortable pace. This allowed us to process fewer tons each day, maximizing the percentage of intact, whole berries in our fermenters and keeping the juicing of the berries during de-stemming to a minimum. This set the stage for a very gradual start to fermentation.

2019 Freestone-Occidental

The 2019 Freestone-Occidental is a precise, site-specific pinot noir that clearly reflects its place of origin. The 2019 growing season was ideal for growing world-class pinot noir. The summer months were cooler than normal and these mild, slow ripening conditions (with very little disease pressure) lasted until mid-September when our vineyards finally reached the early edge of ripeness and we began to pick. For the next ten days, temperatures remained below normal and we were able to continue picking at a comfortable pace, just as each block reached its optimum degree of ripeness – a winemaker's dream that seldom comes true.

The 2019 Freestone-Occidental wine shares the same winemaking techniques as our vineyard-designated pinot noirs. The Freestone-Occidental wine approaches the quality of our best vineyard designates. One important reason for this is that each year, we are harvesting more fruit from our young Bodega Ridge Vineyard, which has nearly reached full production. Soon we will reach our goal of sourcing all the fruit for the Freestone-Occidental wine from our coastal Bodega Headlands and Bodega Ridge vineyards. As a result, the 2019 Freestone-Occidental carries the elusive, signature saline quality of our ridge top vineyards that makes them so compelling.

The 2019 Freestone-Occidental is finely-etched, high toned, but with a touch more flesh on its bones than the 2018 expression. Crystalline, bright, mouthwatering, with a salty mineral finish, the 2019 Freestone-Occidental evokes juicy red/purple berries and a near perfect balance of finesse and energy.
